





anniversary celebrations—crowned "Queensland Event of the Year" by Motorsport Australia—the 2025 event promises even more excitement with a record-breaking 260 classic cars anticipated to compete.

While cars are the headline act, the event offers so much more beyond the track.



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Entertainment like never before

Welcome to the 2025 Historic Leyburn Sprints! It's sometimes just a cliche when event organisers promise "bigger and better", but we're confident the 29th annual Sprints has plucked another gear and is set to entertain you like never before.

We'll remember 2024 as the best Sprints weekend to date. Celebrating the 75th anniversary of the Leyburn Australian Grand Prix, we welcomed a record 240 entries, an estimated record 18,000 weekend attendance, famous drivers of past generations and even some original 1949 contenders.

It won Queensland Event of the Year from Motorsport Australia – a second time for this award, after 2017.

The momentum from last year has driven progress in many areas. But the local community volunteers of the Historic Leyburn Sprints Inc. organising committee are careful to protect the relaxed and friendly grassroots atmosphere and great value that make the event so special year after year.

Unlike most other historic motorsport events, the Sprints also has a big off-track entertainment program. Let's run through everything you can see this weekend -

A record 260 cars in the Sprints competition. At the end of Sunday, the fastest will contest the exciting new Top 10 Shootout.

Motorsport Alley. Just inside the main spectator entry gate in MacIntyre Street, you'll find a fabulous display of cars, from an



ultra-rare Jaguar XJ13 sports car, a Ferrari and 100-year-old Austin to an example of Queensland's own Supercar, the exotic Giocattolo Group B.

Vintage Van Village is a special new location on the outside of Turn One for the ever-popular Vintage Van display. It's a great family-pleaser, with live music on Saturday afternoon.

The **Shannons Show 'n' Shine**, organised by Aces and Eights Car Club, returns on Sunday with a glittering line-up in the grounds of St Matthews Catholic Church, at the top of Warwick Street.

View the **1949 Australian**

Grand Prix trophy, "found" after more than 20 years and on special display in Warwick Street.

VIP driver guests, including 1977 AGP winner Warwick Brown and Queensland 150 Icon Dick Johnson, will sign autographs on both days at the Shannons Insurance display.

Merchandise collectors will make a bee-line for the sales tent in Warwick Street, next door to the Event HQ. It's a complete new range of items – tempting!

Get out your phone and go online to enter the **raffles** for a mega weekend for two at the Supercars Gold Coast 500 plus Supercheap

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Top 10 shootout to close Sprints

A new Top 10 Shootout with the weekend's fastest drivers battling head-to-head for the outright win will provide an exciting climax to this year's Historic Leyburn Sprints.

After the end of the Sprints field's scheduled seven runs against the clock, the Top 10 each will have a final chance in a special eighth run to set fastest time and win the Col Furness Memorial perpetual trophy.

However, while the drivers will have the opportunity then to improve their previous best time, the winner will be the fastest set on any run across the weekend.

Organising committee President Tricia Chant promises it will be an exciting conclusion to the weekend for drivers and spectators.

"Very often the fastest times have been set on the last runs of the weekend when the cooler conditions are favourable, so there's no reason the winner can't come

from a do-or-die effort in the Top 10 Shootout. All runs will count, but there will certainly be plenty of incentive for the Top 10, including a special winner's trophy and a new podium ceremony for the final three," she said.

"We canvassed the usual leading drivers and all of them welcomed the idea enthusiastically. And there's a variety of cars among them, from specialised single-seaters to sports and touring cars, so

the competition will be fascinating.

"It will be an extra attraction for spectators too, giving them a good reason to stay right to the end and applaud the winners on the podium."

The Top 10 Shootout is expected to focus on Australian Hillclimb Champion Dean Amos's bid to win a 10th Sprints in his Gould GR55B V8 – and whether he can top his own record lap time of 39.37 seconds set in 2019.

But key rival Brett Bull – he finished third, after Warwick Hutchinson, in 2024 - has self-built a new, super-lightweight racer powered by a turbocharged Kawasaki motorcycle engine and says he'll relish the chance for an extra run against the clock.

"It's a fantastic idea - I usually do my fastest run at the last," says Bull. "I really enjoy the Sprints. It's one of the things I look forward to all year and it's a wonderful social event too."

Unmissable delights on display

The Historic Leyburn Sprints is rightly renowned for its huge variety of competing cars – a record 260 this year – but there are even more amazing sights lined up in our expanded Motorsport Alley zone, just inside the main spectator entry gate in MacIntyre Street.

Every one has a story, so you're encouraged to talk to their custodians and find some fascinating information.

In 1949, this MG was raced with single-seater bodywork – known as the Red Cigar – by Dick Cobden, but retired after six laps. After a 1960 crash, it was re-bodied in traditional square-rigger style and has been owned by the Redman family since 1966.

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Just one quad-cam V12, mid-engined XJ13 was built by Jaguar to contest the Le Mans 24 Hours in the mid-1960s to rival the Ferraris, Porsches and Fords, but it never raced. Its beauty and exotic V12 mid-engine specification have encouraged a handful of replicas around the world.



This car won the 1952 NSW Grand Prix Handicap. It also competed in the 1958 Australian Grand Prix at Bathurst, but retired on lap 2 due to suspected sabotage. The car was successfully run at tracks including Gnoo Blass, Mount Druitt and Bathurst.



Just 15 examples of the Giocattolo were built in Queensland by entrepreneur Paul Halstead and former McLaren Formula 1-CanAm engineer Barry Lock.



Succeeding the Ferrari 330 P3, the curvaceous V12 P4 delivered Enzo Ferrari a crushing 1-2-3 at the 1967 Daytona 24 Hour race in response to the Ford GT40's Le Mans 24 Hours victory the year before.



Jack Brabham acquired this ex-works Cooper in 1958 and his continuing development of the pioneering rear-engine design and 2.2 Coventry Climax engine led to his Formula 1 World Championships in 1959 and 1960.

1949 Grand Prix cars live on

On 18 September 1949, 28 cars started the Australian Grand Prix at Leyburn. Happily, 13 are known to still exist and there's little doubt a few more are "resting" in sheds awaiting re-discovery.

MG TB Special, no 19: Finished 4th, driver Peter Critchley. Currently owned in Queensland by Colin Schiller.



Hudson Special, no 1: Pole position, DNF. driver Frank Kleinig. Straight-eight Hudson machine currently resides in Victoria.



MG TC Special, no. 20: Finished 2nd, driver Ray "Laddie" Gordon. Currently being restored in Victoria.



GK Ford Special, no 6: DNF, driver Ross Gray. Restored and resides in Maryborough, Queensland and on display at the Sprints.

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Motorsport Event of the Year

The 2024 Historic Leyburn Sprints was named Queensland State Event of the Year by Motorsport Australia after its successful 75th anniversary celebration of the 1949 Leyburn Australian Grand Prix.

The honour was announced at the annual Motorsport Australia Awards presentation in Brisbane, when State champions and other awards were presented by Motorsport Australia Chief Executive Sunil Vohra.

The 28th annual Sprints was the most successful on record, attracting around 18,000 people across the weekend.

Accepting the award, Sprints President Tricia Chant said: "The 2024 Queensland State Event of the Year award is a huge thrill for everyone involved with the Historic Leyburn Sprints. We're one big family – the volunteer community organisers, Motorsport Australia officials, the competitors and the

loyal spectators and supporters who all return every August for a wonderful celebration of grassroots motorsport.

"Last year was truly special. It was an enormous weekend and our VIP former grand prix drivers were blown away by the atmos-

sphere and scale of an event they had known little about.

"The Sprints brings a very significant community and economic benefit to the Southern Darling Downs region."

Southern Downs Mayor Melissa Hamilton congratulated the Sprints organisers and highlighted the role volunteers play in making the event an annual success.

"Huge congratulations to Tricia and all of the volunteers who have made the Historic Leyburn Sprints such an iconic event and which draws so many visitors to our region every year," Mayor Hamilton said.

"Your commitment and hard work are the driving force behind this remarkable achievement.

"Beating out events at major facilities like Willowbank and Morgan Park is a massive achievement. The Historic Leyburn Sprints is truly a one-of-a-kind event that

transforms an entire town."

Peter Homan, CEO of Queensland Country Tourism, said the Historic Leyburn Sprints was an iconic event that truly put Queensland Country on the map.

"Leyburn Sprints has history, heart and a whole lot of horsepower and this well-deserved recognition from Motorsport Australia reinforces what we already know - Leyburn knows how to put on a fantastic event," Mr Homan said.

"The 75th anniversary was a huge milestone, drawing visitors from far and wide, showcasing just how special Leyburn is. This event not only honours the legacy of the Australian Grand Prix but also drives visitation and economic benefit to the region.

"I love capturing a bit of everything,
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Slice of local history, 76 years ago

The Historic Leyburn Sprints, now in its 29th year, commemorates the running of the Australian Grand Prix on a track just outside the town on 18 September 1949. Prominent New South Wales driver John Crouch, driving a French-built Delahaye 135S, won the 150.5-mile (242.2 kilometres) event by almost five minutes from Ray (Laddie) Gordon (MG TC Special) and Arthur Rizzo (Riley Special).


The 6.9 kilometre circuit was laid out on the runways and taxiways of a decommissioned wartime airbase located six kilometres north of Leyburn. It was roughly triangular and comprised two wide, straight runways linked by taxiways. The longest straight, 7000 feet (2.14 km), allowed high speeds and Crouch won at an average of 82.5 mph (132.8 kmh).

Contemporary reports said an estimated 30,000 spectators ar-

rived in 6000 cars and seven aeroplanes. People stood four-deep at the track edge while police with loudspeakers urged them to keep back.

The grand prix almost didn't happen – the race was planned originally for another airfield circuit, Lowood in the Lockyer Valley, until local residents said they didn't want a motor race to be run on a day of religious worship. And so Leyburn had its historic day of glory.

John Crouch went on to many other racing successes, while the exotic Delahaye ended up in the Mullin Museum in California. Crouch died in Gosford, NSW, in 2004, two years after he visited the Sprints with his Australian Grand Prix trophy. This was the last time the trophy was seen in Leyburn until its return this year, thanks to its current owner.

country pubs, the kind that serves up stories with every schooner.

Head west to Toowoomba, where Scotty's Garage & Barn is a motoring enthusiast's dream. Soak up this tribute to Aussie motoring history, set in a nostalgic 1950s backdrop. Then switch gears and soak up the charm of the Jondaryan Woolshed, Australia's oldest and largest operating

woolshed, where heritage meets horsepower.

Cruise into the Western Downs and explore the Miles Historical Village Museum. Take a step back in time with one of the best-preserved colonial town streets in the country. It's the perfect detour for history buffs and vintage lovers.

Further south, the Southern Downs and Granite Belt region

offers gourmet pit stops at cellar doors and farm gates. Don't miss the high-altitude vineyards and cool-climate wines of Stanthorpe, an ideal place to refuel the soul.

In Goondiwindi, admire the classic architecture or take a scenic drive along the Barwon Highway, where the paddocks roll out like bright green racetracks under big blue skies.

Take the road less travelled and detour north-west to the Queensland Central Highlands, where you can try your luck fossicking for precious gems in The Sapphire Gemfields. Who knows, you might strike gold... or at least a sapphire or two!

So once the chequered flag drops at Leyburn, don't just head home. Hit the road and explore Queensland Country. It's a ride you won't want to miss.

like a breath of fresh air.



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Ten contenders for Junior award

This year's regularity competition for the Mike and Ann Collin Memorial Junior Trophy welcomes 10 drivers aged between 14 and 17.

In its seventh year, the Junior award is designed to encourage and assist young drivers taking early steps in their motorsport careers. Where better to learn than in the midst of 250 fellow drivers keen to see them succeed?

The competition offers great prizes and the honour of winning a prestigious award, which honours the memory of the late Sprints founders, inaugural Race Director Mike Collins and President Ann Collins. The couple held a strong commitment to encouraging young competitors. The Junior regulations aim to develop skill, precision and patience ahead of raw, youthful speed. Drivers are given an opportunity to set a target lap time during practice and then must keep as close to that time during their competition runs.

Consistency wins, faster or slower loses points. It's a bigger challenge than it appears and even older and experienced drivers can find it difficult. The Juniors also can compete separately in the main Sprints competition, where they can test their speed. Cars must be under 2.0 litres and not turbocharged or supercharged. Boys dominate the Juniors entry list, but not the results: Stevie Chant won in 2022 and Sophia Devitt in 2023. Last year's winner

Jye Wickham is back for a second shot. He says: "I am from Warwick and I started racing three years ago. I got into motorsport through my family 'army' – grandfather Dan O'Mara and uncle Jason O'Mara.

"The thing I love most about motorsport is the speed, the challenges, the noise and the adrenaline. I also love all of the mates I have met through racing and getting amongst the cool cars, having fun on and off the track."

Great trip down memory lane

VIP guests visited the site of the 1949 Australian Grand Prix during the 75th anniversary celebrations at last year's Historic Leyburn Sprints.

Any remnants of the 6.9 kilometre ex-war-time airfield circuit have long been resumed by farmland, but there remains a memorial plaque at the roadside, where the visitors gathered to contemplate what the remote scene would have been like on grand prix day, 18 September 1949. Thirty-thousand visitors were reported to have watched the race between 28 cars, won by John Crouch in a Delahaye 135S.

To visit the memorial, take the Millmerran-Leyburn Road north from Leyburn, past Liberator Park. At crossroads approximately 5 kms north of Leyburn, go straight ahead into what becomes Macquarie Drive. The memorial is a few hundred metres ahead on the left verge and is easily seen.

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GP celebrations roaring success

A big crowd, superb weather and record entries combined for a spectacular 75th anniversary celebration of the 1949 Australian Grand Prix at the Historic Leyburn Sprints last year.

In front of an estimated total weekend attendance of 18,000 – a record - Lismore driver Dean Amos steered his Gould GR55B to a ninth outright win and the Col Furness Memorial Trophy, with a time of 40.732 seconds around Leyburn's 1.0 kilometre course.

More than 240 historic, classic and performance cars contested the Sprints, but it was the variety of off-track events and attractions that helped make the heritage festival an unprecedented success.

Visitors flocked to meet guest motor-racing personalities Warwick Brown, Dick Johnson, John Bowe, Bruce Allison, Ron Harrop, Charlie O'Brien and Brian Gelding. The guests signed autographs, rode in a grand parade each day

and visited the disused site of the 18 September 1949 grand prix outside town with the MG TB Special – now owned by Sprints regular Colin Schiller - that had finished fourth in the race.

Brown, the 1977 Australian Grand Prix winner, and Motorsport Australia President Andrew Fraser unveiled a 75th AGP Anniversary

plaque that is mounted permanently near the Sprints start line in Macintyre Street.

While Queensland 150 Icon Johnson is a regular Leyburn visitor and valued supporter, his fellow guests said they were amazed by the Sprints popularity and grassroots atmosphere.

The town usually is home to

around 350 residents, but it was packed throughout the weekend, with up to 5000 people occupying multiple campsites around the precinct. Sprints President Tricia Chant said the weekend result was a reward for much hard work by the volunteer organising committee and supportive local community.

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"We had plenty of things planned for the Leyburn grand prix 75th anniversary, but the response was amazing and I'm sure has confirmed Leyburn as Queensland's most popular motorsport event after Supercars," she said.

John Bowe said: "It's the best motorsport event I think I've ever been to in my life.

If I'd known it was this good I would have come years ago.

It's just got this awesome vibe where everybody's here for the right reasons because they love cars and motorsport."

Brian Gelding said: "It's fantastic. We've been to many events like this around the world and this would rank up there with them. It's probably the friendliness of the people here that I like most. The cars are fantastic and the people driving them are the salt of the earth."

Charlie O'Brien said: "I was totally surprised when I came here and saw how many people were here. It's a magnificent event and I congratulate everyone involved."

Saturday in particular was packed with happy, friendly people all day and into the charity auction in the evening. The atmosphere at night around town was magical, with many drivers bedding down beside their race cars in the street and campfire parties happening in residents' front yards and at the campsites.

"And then during the day we had a fantastic grassroots Sprints competition, with everything from a 99-year-old Austin with an 84-year-old driver, to Ferraris, muscle cars and a 350 km/h Indianapolis 500 racer billed 'too fast to win' because Leyburn is just a tight course.

"I congratulate Dean Amos on his ninth win after a good battle with Warwick Hutchinson, who himself has four outright trophies here. Congratulations also to David Cross as the fastest driver in an historic car and to 16-year-old Jye Wickham winning the Junior competition.

"It was a weekend with grassroots motorsport at its core, but that gave much, much more."

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


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
